





Boxwood Blight: Invasive Disease Alert

Pathogen (fungus) Calonectria pseudonaviculata (syn. Cylindrocladium pseudonaviculatum, C. buxicola)

Hosts Various within the Buxaceae family; confirmed on Buxus, Pachysandra, and Sarcococca

Symptoms

Leaf Spots

Spots start off as light or dark brown circular areas on leaves, usually with a yellow halo. As the spots increase in size, the entire leaf will become blighted.

Stem Cankers

Dark brown or black, diamond-shaped or linear cankers are clearly defined against the green stems.

Defoliation

This is a characteristic symptom of boxwood blight as other, more common boxwood problems do not cause defoliation.
